





Comparison of Mean Scores




































How likely are you to recommend this course to other students?

His grading is too difficult. Should also review his grading criteria for some things because sometimes they're uneven in the sense that some things shouldn't be worth so much.
Andrew Hawryshkewich is a phenomenal Instructor. He is the best Instructor I've had so far in my student career. He has the novel idea of creating his Lecture Slides as short, brief morsels of information. Students are incredibly engaged because he talks more to students than he does relying on what is in his Slides.
While some may find him to be a hard marker, I find Andrew to be very fair. When approached for critiques or an explanation for a grade, he'll give abundant, honest feedback and constructive criticisms.
I believe the instructor could focus a bit more on the design component as much as he does on the information architecture.
Andrew's great. He tries really hard to be a good teacher and have his assignments marked fairly. If this was on paper, I'd draw a kangaroo with glasses, but it's not, so I can't.

There were some moments early in the term where the communication lines were breaking down between him, City Studio/City of Vancouver, the TAs, and the students, where assignment details were put out that were unclear, and were mixed up between instructor to students, instructor to TA, and TA to students.

Andrew does have interest in the material and knows what he is talking about. However the course itself is poorly designed, the assignments given do not work well to enhance the course itself. The topics covered don't mesh well and integrate to the next, I feel like I had to learn things on my own time and that I didn't learn anything through the lectures. Therefore it seemed as if assignments were tacked on just for the sake of assignments. The final assignment in this course being fairly challenging, no help was provided in labs or in lecture in order to help complete the final assignment. The course itself needs to introduce core ideas and communicate that to the students in lectures! Students aren't just going magically have the knowledge of html, css, and Java. All of which are barely even covered in class. If our final assignment requires the knowledge of substantial html, Css coding, then ensure to teach that skill in class.

I do worry about the aspect where assignments are marked in groups. Especially when your TA is new to the course and is generally soft spoken, if I were to just rely on their feedback alone and meeting their expectations, are those the same expectations as compared to when the group marks them? I guess what I'm trying to say is more opportunities to get feedback by all the people who will be marking your work would be good.

This has been a really useful class, I feel. Even if I were to not go into web design or interactive systems, I feel that

knowing the coding and concepts taught in this class could be useful for other work and for communicating ideas to others.

I believe sometimes the grading is not fairly equally to work done but I believe that is more due to the TA's marking and not Andrew.

Two things:

- the content this term was driven by the course's collaboration with City Studio. While working with City Studio is always interesting, I feel that it really changed the direction of the course to have our assignments be built for their specific purposes. I'm not sure how the course goes in other terms, for example what their assignments look like, but for me, I found the course work quite difficult a lot of the time.

- My other point is that I came into the course from the FPA/SCA section of the school, having taken one other IAT course previously. While I think it's great that IAT 235 accepts non-IAT majors/minors, I felt like a lot of the time the course instructors and TAs talked about where this course leads for IAT majors/minors, and about what lead to this course as well. This made me feel like I would be graded at the same standard that a second year IAT major would be, and this was something that stressed me out quite a bit halfway through the term. All I mean to make note of is that if this course is available to other majors/programs/etc, it should not be mandatory for IAT students, so that there isn't academic pressure put on those of us just taking the course and not staying in IAT.

In general, the course is really good; however, it would be better if we can have more time for the coding quiz. It was really stressful to develop html/css code in 1 hr.

I've heard it was made more difficult this year, which isn't great, but it outlines some very useful skills (HTML, CSS, and information management). Has a little bit of something for everyone.

While Andrew tried to make it fair so the groups were somewhat equal and did the same amount of work, I found that I had to do the most because of my partners lack of html and css skills. I can't complain because while they tried to help I found it was easier to take over what they were doing. In the end I learned a lot about how to design web pages that I hope I can use in the future.

The course should be focused fully on information design, or on HTML and CSS. Learning both created an odd disconnect between the first project and the rest of the course. It also made it more difficult to learn HTML and CSS as we had less time to learn it, and didn't have as much mental capacity to focus on it. Otherwise, the course was very useful. Should come with a recommendation to take this course in a semester SEPARATE from 233. The 2 courses teach very important concepts and have weekly deliverables. I would have liked to have spent more time learning HTML and good information design, but had to manage my time between the 2 courses.

Maybe just try to make some Canvas deliverables a bit more clear? There were a lot of times where I was unsure of what content we were supposed to be actually handing in.
